Big Fishing Creek Bridge Job to start March 27 near Clintondale Detour will be in place

Lock Haven, PA –Starting March 27, a detour will be in place as work begins to replace a bridge on Route 2004 (Furnace Road) near the village of Clintondale in Porter Township, Clinton County. PennDOT's official detour will make use of Route 2002 (Washington Avenue/Narrows Road), Route 64, Silver Avenue (Township Road 335), and Furnace Road (Township Road 323). The detour will remain in place until the new bridge is open to traffic.

The current bridge was built in 1919 and carries an average of more than 600 vehicles daily. Replacing the bridge will allow PennDOT to remove it from the structurally deficient list.

Overall work will include replacement of the current bridge with a new, 87-foot, two-span, pre-stressed concrete bridge, roadway re-alignment, drainage and guide rail updates, pavement markings, and miscellaneous items. All work is weather and schedule dependent.

LTT Trucking, LLC of North Bend, PA is the contractor on this \$920,000 project. The new bridge is expected to open in early August. Drivers are reminded to follow detour signs, obey posted speed limits and use caution in and around work zones.

Motorists can check conditions on more than 40,000 roadway miles, including color-coded winter conditions on 2,900 miles, by visiting www.511PA.com. 511PA, which is free and available 24 hours a day, provides traffic delay warnings, weather forecasts, traffic speed information and access to more than 700 traffic cameras.
